

This **public workshop** will cover current information on EAB and answer residents' questions concerning its effect on our city. Private property owners will learn how to make plans for their own ash trees.

Emerald ash borer is an insect of Asian origin that is rapidly making its way across Iowa, threatening all of our ash trees. It tunnels under the bark, thereby cutting off water and nutrients and ultimately killing the tree. The City of Des Moines has a plan for managing public ash trees, and residents will likewise need have a plan to manage ash trees on private property. Options include chemical treatment of healthy, structurally sound ash trees, and removal of dying or dead trees. Residents will learn more about their options at this workshop, and be better prepared to make their own management plans.
